RWEFRA – Who are we?

Rwenzori Fraternity is a non-partisan association of people hailing from the Rwenzori Region. Rwefra was founded in 2014 as a loose WhatsApp platform, and later fully registered as a formal association in 2016. It was initially established by members with an objective to share challenges and way forward on matters of security, increasing violence, and other crises that had engulfed Kasese District and more generally the Rwenzori region. Through the platform, members thought that they could make a contribution to resolving these issues, and foster unity and development of communities. The forum was later embraced by a sizeable number of individuals both from the Rwenzori Region and other areas of Uganda and those living outside Uganda.




























Applaud the former Team!!

b). Lala Salama Funeral Insurance

Even in the hands of the World's best medical doctors, death at times is inevitable. As Rwefra members, we purpose to send off our loved ones with dignity by way of arranging a befitting sendoff. To do it better, we had to partner with one of the best funeral service providers in East Africa and beyond called Uganda Funeral Services Ltd. Over 80 members enrolled for the service by pay death insurance package through Sanlam insurance company who are the insurance specialists of Uganda Funeral Services Limited

2. Condolence Contribution.

This policy was passed to support colleagues and families in emergency circumstances such as death for their immediate loved one. As is our Bakonzo culture, such families need financial support (embulhulhu) to help them go through the painful and often costly period of sending-off their loved ones. Rwefra has commiserated with a number of families during their most difficult times. The condolence policy has proved so far to be one of the best. The policy recommends support in times of loss of immediate family member – in this case, restricted to parent, your wife, and your children. However, out of being one family, Rwefra has gone beyond the policy recommendations and come together as individuals to support families that have lost loved ones outside the above nucleus prescription. Members need to note that this policy recommends that once collections are made, a 10% is retained by treasury for purposes of any other sup-



port that may be required for a colleague. In addition, the Policy is not only about death, it also prescribes circumstances of support in cases of disease and other emergencies. We encourage members to understand the policy more, so that in case we need to make amendments, then we could make them where necessary.

For 2018-2019 only one family has benefited from the bereavement policy we thank God for has been on our side and we pray for his continued proctection even in the followings years. For accountability refer to table 1

The feedback so far received from participants has been encouraging.

A total of 3,700,000m was collected after costs. Of this 1,340,000= has been invested with the SACCO and balance with the RWEFRA welfare account.

(a) The Rwefra monthly market day

This happens every last friday of the month. Its an opportunity for members to showcase their bunisses and investment opportunities they have to offer. Testomonies from members indeed show that this plateform has offered a link between businesses and potentail clients. We think we will continue with this arrangement and make it even better.

(b) The RWEFRA SSACO

Rwefra has continued to growth the SACCO arm after we realized this could be the fastest route to liberate our members economically. We have now made it mandatory for every new entrant to be a member of the SACCO as a pre-requisite to being a member of Rwefra. We anticipate this is going to increase our membership and raise our portfolio. The details of our standings as of now is below:

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

- 1. Members have realized the benefits of both shares and savings hence the increased shares as observed. However, we continue to encourage more savings very seriously and still have shares on market that close on 30th June for the year 2019.
- 2. Rwefra Sacco is progressively growing and making profits for its members investment as well as benefiting members to realize their dream projects.
- The SACCO continues to lend at 5% interest per month on reducing balance of borrowed money, 2% interest for loans borrowed and paid back within 1 week and 3% flat rate interest for School fees loans (School fees loan opens for a window of two weeks only).
- 4. All loans remain short term loans payable in 3 months from the date of borrowing.
- 5. We have a Property loan service to assist members who can afford 70% of the property amount, and SACCO comes in to loan you the balance of 30% at the same interest rates and terms mentioned above but you handover the title and transfer forms to Sacco which shall be handed back to you at full payment of the loan.
- 6. We thank all Rwefra members who have endeavored to join the SACCO and continue to save and buying shares. We call upon all those still hesitating to join to do so to enable every member benefit from the SACCO as it grows with better future prospects.
- 7. Entry fee is 50,000 (20,000= Membership, 20,000= Annual Subscription & 1 compulsory share).
- 8. A share is sold at 10,000/=.
- 9. Minimum monthly required savings is 50,000/=.

A. The RWEFRA SCHOLASTIC MAETRIALS – THE FLAGSHIP PROJECT!!!

The 'Rwefra Scholastic Materials Project' was borne out of a discussion and reflection by members on the challenges facing the education system in the district, particularly the primary school level, which is the foundational level. Rwefra members noted that supporting a primary school going child is seeing them realize their dreams and optimally utilize their potential in the future. Primary education is a foundation upon which future participation in the economy, the politics, and general development, is built. Education is a critical cornerstone to self-empowerment and community development. To achieve this future aspiration however, adequate investments in primary education are apparent. Incidentally, Kasese district is one of districts in Uganda which has been registering high dropout rates in primary schools, low completion rates, and even high failure rates at PLE completion.



A number of factors have been identified as contributors to phenomenon – including limited parental support toward education requirements for their children, limited teaching, and reference and library material for many primary schools, coupled with limited motivation for teachers. It is not surprising these days that a primary child appears at school without writing material. When this is interrogated further, it has been found that parents are struggling economically, yet their children want to study to secure their future. It is apparent that, to make primary school graduates from the district, compete with other districts, the quality of education must improve. However, not all these challenges can be addressed in one go. While we continue to advocate for government to address the issues under the purview of the Ministry of Education, it was incumbent on members of the community to synergize around those issues that are feasible within their means. It was therefore acknowledged that each had a role to play in this endeavor.

It is against this background that the "Rwefra Scholastic Materials Project" was launched under the theme: "Improving the Quality of Primary Education – the foundation for unlocking the Potential of the Rwenzori region". The main objectives of this project were: (1) to reach out to primary school going children with scholastic materials, (2) to put a smile on the disadvantaged child, (3) to instill hope in the community, and (4) to motivate and mentor pupils to complete school. It was expected that through this project, there would be:

- Improved use of scholastic materials by pupils to enhance learning and concentration
- Increased motivation to complete school
- Increased knowledge on career guidance

The drive started in October, 2018 and ended in December 2018, climaxed with the Rwefra Night on December 8, 2018. The drive was aimed at reaching out to 10,000 pupils, with each child receiving half a dozen books. Resources were mobilized through Membership mobilization for individual contributions, appeal to corporate organizations, institutions, business community, and well-wishers, and collections during the Rwefra Nite

Our mandate as a committee is to:

1. Collaborate with other committees in order to provide recommendations on RWEFRA outreach programs

2. Develop and implement actions as assigned in the RWEFRA strategic plan in order to achieve objectives and goals

3. Identify potential areas and networks from where to resource mobilize to support the association and her members

4. Identify strategic partnerships & initiate Strategic collaborations with external individuals/organizations

5. Create an enabling environment for members to frequently engage with their leaders in the Rwenzori region but also provide a feedback mechanism for the community members through the use of media.

6. Provides Input on current and upcoming issues on Public policy that relate to RWEFRA and encourage the effective use of RWEFRA structures to enable members be active participants in the decision making processes in the governance system at all levels especially on issues that impact on their lives.

As a department, and with your support, we have achieved quite a number of things in this year ended, and we wish to bring the following to your attention:



1. Radio Engagements:

Two Radio talk-shows were conducted. While these were conducted to purely popularize the scholastic materials project, it was also used as an opportunity to reach out to our community and sell the name of the Rwefra Association. These were on Kasese Guide Radio and Messiah Radio. During the talk-show, a number of in-radio callers were made, which gave us an opportunity to respond and enlighten the public better on what we are, what we do, and what we stand for.

2. Monitoring and Follow-up of donated items

In the year 2017/2018, Rwefra distributed mattresses to health facilities throughout the district. One of the concerns that emerged then was how facilities could be monitored to understand the extent to which they properly used these donations, but also for accountability. During 2018/2019, the advocacy and engagement sub-committee championed monitoring the effective utilization of the already donated items. Impromptu visits were conducted at Kyalhumba Health Centre III, and Kyalhumba PHC, among others. The committee proposes to continue doing these monitoring programs to ensure Rwefra's effort creates impact in communities. At all facilities were toured, we found that mattresses donated by RWEFRA were being utilized fully and patients and health workers were appreciative and gave praises to RWEFRA as well as well praying for all member. Government still has a lot do in this sector as most of the health facilities do not have proper amenities such as kitchens, bathplaces and toilets. We call upon the district authorities to act. But also all stakeholders lend a hand.

3. The extended Mattress Project

Following the mattress project of 2017/2018, additional facilities that were worth benefiting from the project were identified. Up to 10 mattresses were identified and donated to health facilities in Kyarumba Sub-county. The team used this platform to engage with the community and their leaders about issues of community development. This community engagement and handover team was led by Chairperson David Kongolo. Other members included Dr. Rude Monday Julius, James Cleto, Alex Masereka, and Ms. Annet Kobusinge. The team was also joined by Ms. Justine Mutabazi, a Senior Citizen of the Area and Assistant RDC Kyotera District



4. RWEFRA Night Extension:

The Rwefra Night has been one of the successful annual events, and overtime, it has gained prominence. However, it is held in Kampala, and this constrains some members to attend owing to travel costs and other challenges. It is a challenge particularly to our Kasese Chapter Members. To address this challenge, this year we decided to decentralize this event. To this effect, we organized a parallel Rwefra Night which was dubbed "Extended Rwefra Night", at Sajoca Gardens – Kibaara, Kasese. This event integrated a 'family day' arrangement and was very well received and successful. We used the same event to fundraise resources for the 'scholastic Materials Project'. Over 4 Million Uganda Shillings was raised through this event. We would like to extent our appreciation to the organizing committee of this event





Major challenges for the Advocacy Committee and Looking forward

1. The committee was not able to generate external funding necessary to sustain the activities of the association, yet there is a lot of resource mobilization potential within the team. Much of what was done in the year generally relied on member contributions. This causes fatigue and may not be sustainable in the long-run. The committeee will focus more closely at this issue. We hope to focus on and address this issue in the next year particularly by looking out for calls for proposals for community work and assemble teams when required to respond to those calls. We also request our members to let us know in case they are funding links that we could take advantage of.

Major challenges within the one year (May 2018 – April 2019)

- 1. Slow recruitment
- 2. Disinterest from some members
- 3. Lack of policies around certain activities creates unnecessary anxiety
- 4. Limited resources creating over reliance on member contributions that create fatigue

What is coming up

5. Rwefra publicity and communication guidelines. In a bid to improve and streamline communication to our internal and external audiences, we have developed a set of guidelines to guide our communications. A draft that regulates the use of our WhatsApp group page, the website, the twitter and Facebook accounts is being discussed by the executive. Once passed, it will be disseminated to the General Assembly and all communication after that will be expected to fall within the provisions of those guidelines

- 7. Discussions on social services policy

8. Structuring our priority areas of focus through completing our medium term strategic plan.

MEMBER FEEDBACK

I have benefited from Rwefra in Multiple wats. But I want to speak specifically to the insurance scheme. The insurance scheme led by the welfare fund has greatly helped me handle issues regarding to illness at home. As a background, my firstborn boy Jordan making 3 years is ill with Celebral Palsy. He has been on medical attention since birth, with money not always available, I always know he is covered medically since all they need is transport to and from the hospital. The others on the cover are my other son Jotham and my wife all of whom have been taken care of whenever. This has cut down the bills at visiting the hospital (out patient) right from the pocket that were in the ranges of 120,000/--200,000/-. I surely appreciate Rwefra for having thought worth miles ahead to have in place the insurance scheme [**Rwefra Member**].

Me I have testimony of my time I have been in Rwefra. My testimony is that some people always want to see this association fail or at least its activities but still want to portray as committed members. It has come to my notice that overtime, some members use fellow members to fight their personal wars. Personally I have learnt to accommodate members the way they are. I have also noticed a mentality of some members thinking anything can't move here without them and if they are not involved will try to make everything look like nothing was done. Lastly but most important, I have made friends **[Rwefra Member].**.

As a memeber of this association i think we have done alot and we need to strive to do even better in the coming years. I personally would propose the following areas of focus.

1. Engage more our leaders and all other stakeholders at different levels

2. Partner more with civil society, NGOs and other community development organisations working within our communities.

3. We should engage more with the business community including organising a business round table as one of our annual events. This will create opportunities for our communities.

4. I propose that in this coming year we organise hiking of Rwenzori Mountain as RWEFRA to promote tourism and apprecaite our nature and nurture. (**RWEFRA** *member*).

The Association through its Executive Committee sponsored the Annual General Meeting for the Financial Year 20182019.




